Honorary membership is the highest honour that the EAO can bestow on individuals who have contributed greatly both to science in the field of implant dentistry and to the association. Only six individuals have received this recognition up until now.

The EAO is delighted to present Honorary membership to Friedrich Neukam in acknowledgement of his outstanding contributions to the field and to the EAO. Professor Neukam was appointed Head of the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Erlangen-Nuremberg University in 1995, and held this position until 2017.

Professor Neukam has been heavily involved with the EAO since 2001 when he joined the Board of Directors, remaining on the board until 2010. He was appointed Secretary General in 2004 and became President of the association in 2006. Professor Neukam has also been involved in the organisation of a number of landmark EAO events. He chaired the annual scientific meeting in Munich in 2005. In 2011 he also co-chaired the congress in Athens.

Professor Neukam has served as Editor-in-Chief of the Journal "Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery", President of the German Association of Oral Implantology (DGI), and received an honorary doctorate from the Medical Faculty of the University of Athens in 2010.
